The most significant barrier to helping victims of sex trafficking is also the most basic: *identifying them.*

In 2016, 91% of the domestic minor sex trafficking victims served in Georgia were enrolled in school when first approached by a trafficker.

So why didn't the teachers and counselors report this? Why didn't they embrace the child and protect them? The problem isn't that educators don't care, it's that *they aren't equipped to identify a victim and act.*

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Educators need to be educated.
