Traffickers don't look like the stereotypical pimp; they look like you and me. They could be the cute guy in the coffee shop, the nice woman in the mall, or the friendly student on campus. But even if you avoid strangers in the real world, you are still vulnerable. Traffickers can meet and begin grooming victims without ever leaving home. Social media, dating and sugar baby platforms are prime hunting grounds.

Rescuing Hope teaches young adults how to protect themselves and those around them from falling victim to a trafficker by sharing insights and cautionary tales.
